

## **EXHIBIT C: BULLOCH COUNTY AGRICULTURAL COMPLEX**

### **RULES AND REGULATIONS**

- Those responsible for horses, ponies, donkeys, mules, or hinnies must have a current Coggins certificate for each animal; the Licensee is responsible for verifying the Coggins certificate. All animals must be free of any contagious, infectious, or communicable disease. In addition, any special rules or regulations required by the Georgia Department of Agriculture for a particular species must be followed.
- In the event of a deceased animal, the owner of the animal will be responsible for prompt removal and disposal of the animal; provided, however, that if, in the sole judgment of the Licensor, there is any indication of infectious disease, the deceased animal must remain on site until the Georgia Department of Agriculture conducts an inspection and authorizes the removal and disposal of the animal. If the owner does not promptly remove and dispose of the animal, Licensor shall remove and dispose of the animal and Licensee shall be responsible for paying a Deceased Animal Removal Fee. The determination of “promptness” shall be within the sole discretion of Licensor.
- All syringe needles must be discarded in a medical waste disposal container.
- Horses or any other livestock are prohibited in public spectator areas, including but not limited to all food service and spectator seating areas.
- The riding of horses and tie ups within the confines of the R/V campsites is prohibited.
- No overnight tie out of any livestock is allowed. Livestock must be stored overnight in a stall or trailer.
- Only one horse per stall is permitted.
- Licensee is responsible for booking, assigning, staffing, and cleanup of any stalls that turnover during an event. Licensor will be responsible for the setup and cleanup before and after the event.
- Gas, electric or propane heaters, propane tanks, hot plates, AC window units, refrigerators and microwaves are prohibited in stall areas at all times. This is to protect the stalls from fire and electrical circuit overload.

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- Dispose of all bedding waste and manure from stalls in designated areas only.
- No littering; trash receptacles are available for your convenience.
- No confetti may be used for any purpose.
- No smoking is permitted in any buildings, including but not limited to covered arenas, stalls and restrooms.
- Unloading and loading must take place in designated areas. Unloading/loading must be done in a timely manner.
- All vehicles and trailers must be parked in designated areas.
- All aisles and roadways must be kept open at all times to provide a fire lane.
- No hay, shavings, or foreign materials are allowed in any arenas without prior approval from management. Do not dig holes or pour liquids on arena floor.
- No tents shall be erected, or anchor stakes of any kind placed without prior approval of management. Licensee shall be responsible for any cost incurred as a result of damages to infrastructure such as electrical, water, irrigation or sewer lines.
- No use of tape or driving of any nails, screws, etc. is allowed on or into any partition of the Facilities for the purpose of attaching decorations, hanging tack, supplies, buckets, etc.
- Posters, flyers, and other printed materials shall not be stapled on any building. They may be posted on designated billboards only.
- All equipment or material brought to the site must be removed at the end of the event.
- If an event requires ambulance or EMS services, the Licensee is responsible for contacting and paying for such services. For additional information, contact the Bulloch County EMS/Rescue at 912-764-6188.
